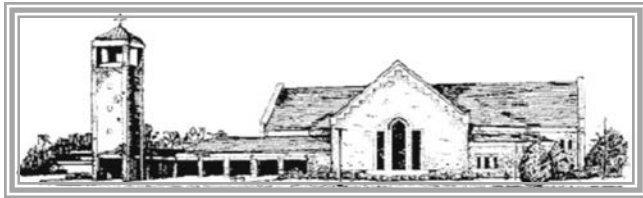

Letters from the Bishop - Catholic Times and Church in Latin America

My dear friends in Christ,

I have heard from many of you how pleased you are with the redesigned Catholic Times, the official “magazine” of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. It is the culmination of more than a year of research on how best to freshen this venerable publication. The CT staff is continuing to tweak the new magazine format.

My column, “Lex Cordis Caritas,” is on page 4 of each issue. It is one of the best ways that I can speak to you about the issues that we face as Catholics in central Illinois and the nation. As your bishop, it is important for me to be an active participant in Catholic media. Catholic Times strives to report on the people and issues in our diocese and the extraordinary work ahead of us all; issues that were highlighted during our diocesan synod in 2017.

Catholic Times emphasizes the achievements and activities of our Catholic youth and school students throughout our diocese. I am honored each January to accompany hundreds of our young people who publicly display their faith by participating in the March for Life in Washington, D.C. Our Catholic Athletes for Christ hosted Senior Springboard, where graduating senior athletes from the seven Catholic high schools in the Springfield diocese were recognized. Also, in 2018, Catholic Times reported extensively on the historic fourth Diocesan Synod that culminated in the adoption of the declarations and statutes committing ourselves to be a diocese of intentional missionary disciples. Catholic Times will continue to track the important issues of freedom of conscience that face Catholics in Illinois and beyond. Our coverage of the enactment of House Bill 40 and the sin of abortion that it perpetrates will continue in 2019 as Catholic Times follows the fate of the decision that compels citizens to pay for abortion coverage for those with state insurance or Medicaid.

I believe that Catholic Times should be available to every household in our diocese, either online or by mail. Your \$15 annual subscription will help ensure that it remains an inexpensive source of information on the vital issues I have noted.
