This is a Hispanic tradition where the dead are honored and celebrated during the month of November, especially on All Saints Day and All Souls Day. In many countries, it is a celebration of life **and** death, that honors their memory with food, music, dance and parades. Symbolism plays an important role in the festivities, where an altar is created to honor the loved ones with flowers, foods, decorations, and other things the loved ones enjoyed while they were here on earth. You may also bring a small item to place next to the photo that reminds you of their time on earth, maybe a religious symbol, food, animal or other memento, or a simple flower or decoration. Please make sure it is not something valuable or irreplaceable, as we **can not guarantee 100%** that it will be returned, though we will try. If you would like to place a label with your loved one's name on the front of the photo, that would be fine. Please stick a label or tape on the back of the frame and on the memento with your name on it so we make sure it is returned.
